

SENATE SUMMARY MEETING OF JUNE 11, 2018

1. Report of the Chair

The Chair, on behalf of Senate, welcomed the following new and re-elected Senators:

The Chair reported on recent research grant successes:

- Nosyk Bohdan of Health Sciences received \$486,000 from *Health Canada* for a three year project on the development of a comprehensive performance measurement system for opioid use disorder in British Columbia.
- 21 SFU researchers were awarded a total of \$216,000 from *Mitacs' Accelerate, Accelerate Graduate Research Partnership* and *Globalink Research Award* programs.
- 6 SFU researchers were successful in the latest round of *NSERC Engage Grants* and have collectively garnered \$146,000 in funding. These grants allow researchers to undertake short-term research and development projects in collaboration with industry partners.
- Peter Ruben of Biomedical Physiology and Kinesiology received \$130,000 from *Akseera Pharma Corporation* for a collaborative project to determine the effects of CBD (cannabidiol) and THC (tetrahydrocannabinol) on the growth and proliferation of prostate cancer cells.

The Chair reported on recent research awards and honours:

- Arthur Robson of Economics has been appointed a *Fellow of the Canadian Economics Association* in recognition of his achievements and contributions to the discipline.
- Isabelle Cote of Biological Sciences has won the *Murray A. Newman Award for Aquatic Research* from the *Coastal Ocean Research Institute* of the *Vancouver Aquarium*. The award celebrates those who've made a

significant contribution to advancing conservation and research in BC and beyond.

The Chair reported that the 2018 *BCTECH Summit* came to a successful close. The three-day summit broke attendance records, drawing over 9,000 participants. As an Innovation Partner, SFU was well represented by means of exhibits, research projects and presentations.

The Chair reported that *KEY*, SFU's Big Data Initiative, is a sponsor of *CANHEIT-TECC* 2018, the largest gathering of Canadian higher education IT leaders. Nearly 600 experts, thought-leaders and changemakers will converge on the Burnaby campus, with *KEY* hosting *CANHEIT* attendees at the Big Data Hub for presentations, breakout meetings, and tours.

The Chair reported SFU's Sustainable Energy Engineering Program received provincial support and approval in May. The 80 student program is set to launch in the fall of 2019, with Kevin Oldknow, professor of Mechatronics Systems Engineering and Associate Dean of FASS, as program director.

The Chair reported that SFU is hosting the 2018 *CAUBO* (*Canadian Association of University Business Officers*) conference. In lieu of speaker gifts, a donation is being made to the *Pat Hibbits Memorial Bursary/Endowment*, who served as SFU's VP, Finance and Administration, for over 14 years.

The Chair reported on recent and upcoming events:

- The Beedie School of Business hosted former Prime Minister Paul Martin at a public event entitled *Advancing Education with Reconciliation*.
- SFU hosted a sold-out AGM and elected a new Alumni Board.
- The Bill Reid Gallery reopened on June 8th.
- Convocation runs from June 12th to 15th
