

# SENATE SUMMARY MEETING OF APRIL 1, 2019

## 1. Report of the Chair

The Chair thanked all who attended the Senate – Board of Governors Retreat and noted that a summary report will be produced for the benefit of both bodies.

The Chair reported on research updates:

- The Honorable Kristy Duncan, Minister of Science and Sport, was at SFU on March 15th and used the occasion to announce that \$746,300 from the *Canadian Foundation for Innovation's John R. Evans Leaders Fund* will be used to improve SFU labs and to purchase equipment to help SFU researchers advance their research goals.
- 5 out of 10 project proposals put forth by SFU to the Canadian Defense Department's IDEaS (Innovation for Defense Excellence and Security) program have received funding totaling over \$900,000. The projects address science and technology challenges faced by the Department.

The Chair reported that SFU participated in the fourth-annual *BC TECH Summit* from March 11-13. SFU experts in artificial intelligence, big data, materials research, computational linguistics, sustainable engineering and entrepreneurship engaged with summit attendees to share their knowledge and to initiate partnerships.

The Chair reported that he, along with the Vice-President, Research and International, headed a SFU delegation at the *Asia Pacific Association for International Education's (APAIE)* annual conference and exhibition held in Kuala Lampur. SFU will be hosting next year's conference and exhibition – *APAIE 2020* – in Vancouver from March 22-26, which marks the first time the conference will be held in the Americas, with over 2400 expected attendees. While SFU will be the lead host for the conference, we will be assisted by cohosts the University of British Columbia, University of Victoria, University of Northern British Columbia, Royal Roads University, and Thompson Rivers University.

The Chair reported that SFU recently broke ground on a new stadium on Terry Fox Field. The 1800 seat facility is scheduled to be completed in 2020.

The Chair reported that the official opening of the building that will house SFU's Sustainable Energy Engineering (SEE) Program will be held on April 25th. Designed by the late Bing Thom, the state-of-the-art structure is built around a grand, forested atrium, and will feature 14 fully connected teaching labs, a machine shop, six classrooms and two theatres, including one that seats 400 people. In addition to housing the new program, the facility will provide much-

needed space for a variety of disciplines, as well as for the broader community. The SEE Program, which commences this September, will help establish BC as a clean-tech and sustainable energy leader.

The Chair reported that the new pub restaurant, *The Study*, officially opened on April 1st. Operated by *Joseph Richard Group* under a contract with SFU, the refurbished facility will be open Monday to Saturday from 11:00 am to 1:00 am and on Sunday from 11:00 am to 12:00 midnight. *The Study* is a 19+ venue that can seat over 300 patrons, with more accommodated outdoors on the patio overlooking the city. Families can bring their children into the venue until 10:00 pm.
