

# SENATE SUMMARY MEETING OF FEBRUARY 1, 2021

#### 1. Report of the Chair

The Chair acknowledged that February is Black History Month and is a time to honor, celebrate and reflect on the stories, experiences and accomplishments of Black Canadians in British Columbia and across the country. The Chair also acknowledged the contributions of Black scholars, past and present, including many scholars at SFU.

The Chair congratulated the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences for their event held on January 27th honoring the 2020-21 Shadbolt Fellows.

The Chair reported that she, in her role as President, is hosting the President's Lecture Series, with the theme this year being SFU's cutting edge research. The first lecture was on January 19th and discussed *The Hidden Gifts of Retail: Resilience and Planning for Community Life*. The next lecture comes up on February 9th discussing the topic of *Envisioning Social Justice From the Margins*.

The Chair reported that preliminary discussions have been held with the Fraser Health Authority and the First Nations Health Authority about possible partnerships for a new medical program at SFU.

The Chair reported that she, in her role as President, continues to meet with external indigenous councils and chiefs on whose territory's SFU's campuses reside. Most recently, a meeting was held with Chief Wayne Sparrow of the Musqueam Nation, as well as representatives of the Kwantlen First Nations to discuss pathways to reconciliation and ways that SFU might partner with their communities.

The Chair reported that SFU has made the 2021 Forbes list of best employers and congratulated everyone who works at SFU for creating a great work environment.
