Dear Jeff,

As part of their work to streamline the MA degree, the School of Public Policy has recently replaced their two-semester MA capstone project sequence, PLCY 808 (5) and 809 (5), with a single 10-unit 809 course. Under the previous structure, a student needing to retake PLCY 809 to complete the MA project paid 50% of the tuition fee for retaking the 5-unit course. The School proposes, and the FASS Deans Office approves, that students needing to retake PLCY 809 now pay 25% of the 10-unit fee, thus keeping the cost of retaking the course the same as before. SPP and FASS also request a 50% fee for students needing to retake PLCY 835 Extended Policy Analysis, the final course in the Course Work Option MA. These changes serve the interests of the few students who need to retake these courses, and will have negligible financial impact on the Faculty.

Accompanying this cover memo are three documents:

- A change in the name, number of credits, and description for PLCY 809. PLCY 809 is the second course in what has been our two-course sequence called Advanced Policy Analysis. PLCY 808 is the first course in this sequence. Each are 5 credits as are all our graduate courses. The 808/809 sequence prepares and guides students through the process of their major independent research project called the capstone project. The capstone is a major piece of research that requires a defence and submission of the capstone to the library. We propose to eliminate PLCY 808 and award 10 credits to PLCY 809, as it will be the primary course during which the capstone is completed. Students will continue to receive supervision by faculty for their capstone over multiple semesters, but this change will streamline faculty resources allocated to the capstone and improve efficiency in the department. The change in name and course description will make it clear that PLCY 809 is the required course for completing the capstone. Students must be registered in PLCY 809 at the time they defend their research and submit their capstone to the library. This change sustains the number of credits required for the Masters in Public Policy (MPP) degree. It reduces the number of courses required for those doing the capstone from 14 to 13 but does not affect tuition paid thus ensuring parity between those doing the capstone and those doing the applied policy project (PLCY 835). The applied policy project option requires students to take an extra elective course in addition to the 4 elective courses required for all to complete the MPP
- A course deletion. To implement the changes introduced above, we propose to delete PLCY 808 from the MPP curriculum.
- Calendar changes. We attach the needed changes in the calendar for PLCY 809 (course title, description, and credit hours), deletion of PLCY 808, and revised description for those undertaking the capstone research option as part of their requirements for the MPP degree. We will update our website accordingly when these changes are approved.

These proposed changes were supported by and approved unanimously at a department meeting in SPP held on 26 January 2021.

Graduate Course Deletion

A course can be deleted if it has not been offered in the previous seven years or if there is no chance of it being offered again. Once a course has been deleted for a minimum of 10 years, the course subject and number can be re-used.
