In Spring 2020, SCUS undertook the task to make the Program GPA calculations more coherent, with the intention of increasing fairness, transparency, and consistency across Faculties, particularly to students enrolled in minor programs.

Since its inception, FASS always included all subject matter courses in Program GPA calculations; to be able to continue with this approach despite the changes introduced by SCUS, we introduced specific calendar language at the FASS UCC meeting in February 2020 (which was reflected in the academic calendar in Fall 2021). The language was intended to ensure that all students graduating with a Bachelor of Arts would complete the same requirements. We also intended that this rule would apply to students who graduated with a double minor, one of which was completed in a different Faculty. Our intention to apply this to all students graduating with a BA in FASS may not have been clearly understood by SCUS and other committees approving the change at the time.

It has become clear since that FASS' presumption at the time was incorrect: even if a student is graduating with a Bachelor of Arts in FASS, but with one minor from a different Faculty, the rules of that other Faculty would apply to the minor. FASS rules would not supersede the original Faculty rules for the minor.

Our FASS students now find themselves considerably disadvantaged in relation to <u>any</u> other SFU student: while only minimum program requirements are now counted toward Program GPA calculations, all courses are counted toward the calculation of Program CGPAs in FASS programs.

FASS proposes to return to the original formulation in the calendar and to delete the Faculty-level degree requirements introduced as of Fall 2021 that require a 2.0 minimum Program CGPA in all subject matter courses. All university requirements will remain, but will be listed under the Faculty requirements for clarification to the students. It remains possible for individual departments in FASS to introduce additional minimum grade requirements for their respective programs as expressively permitted in the current calendar language. FASS encourages departments to reflect upon their Program GPA requirements, particularly in relation to interdisciplinary programs.

FASS is hopeful that this clarification on the Faculty-level degree requirements will provide additional consistency, fairness and transparency.

#### Impact

- satisfaction of the writing, quantitative, and breadth requirements
- an overall cumulative grade point average (CGPA) and upper division overall CGPA of at least 2.0, and program CGPA and upper division program CGPA of at least 2.0 on the course work used to satisfy the minimum program requirements. FASS Departments may define additional GPA requirements for their respective programs.
- an overall cumulative grade point average (CGPA) and upper division CGPA of at least 2.0, and a minimum CGPA and upper division CGPA of at least 2.0 across all units in each subject that is a major, a joint major, a minor, or an extended minor. FASS Departments may define specific requirements for their respective programs.

Existing calendar language does not reflect that students are required to have in progress, or completed an acceptable alternate upper division W course as a pre-requisite for entry into 400 level Business courses.

#### Name of Program or Name of Faculty Business and Psychology Joint Major

#### **Rationale for change**:

PSYC 210 and STAT 270 have been deemed to be acceptable courses for admission to the Business portion of the BUS/PSYC JMA program.

Additionally, removing the BUS 336 requirement for admission to the PSYC portion of the JMA program aligns with internal admission transfer pathways and encourages earlier declaration into the joint major program.

Admission Requirements - Beedie School of Business

Joint Major applicants should apply to Beedie through the internal transfer process, which is outlined <u>here</u>, in the term in which their 45th unit will be completed, including the eight lower division courses required for admission. <del>Students will need to complete BUS 336 (min C-) in their first term in Beedie in order to obtain a waiver for PSYC 210, which is required for admission to the Psychology portion of the joint major. Students not accepted upon initial application may reapply. Unsuccessful candidates are permitted to appeal.</del>

Admission Requirements – Psychology

To be admitted to the Psychology portion of this program, students must complete

PSYC 100 - Introduction to Psychology I (3)



PSYC 102 - Introduction to Psychology II (3) PSYC 201W - Introduction to Research Methods in Psychology (4) with a grade of C (2.0) or better

and complete

PSYC 210 - Introduction to Data Analysis in Psychology (4) or STAT 270 - Introduction to Probability and Statistics (3) or BUS 232 - Data and Decisions I (4) and BUS 336 Data and Decisions II (4) with a grade of C-(1.67) or better

#### **COURSE SELECTION**

Students should complete PSYC 100, 102 and 201 as soon as possible to gain better access to upper division PSYC courses. Students who plan a major in psychology should also complete PSYC 210. Students who have completed BUS 232 and BUS 336 with grades of C - or better are eligible for a waiver of PSYC 210.

The Psychology Department strongly recommends that students do not leave any of these required courses to the end of their degree. If a student is unable to obtain the required grade in PSYC 201, he or she will not be able to graduate with a major in psychology.

To enroll in psychology courses, students are required to meet the prerequisites or special instructions that may be stipulated for each. The listed prerequisites indicate the minimal background expected by instructors.

The Psychology Department reserves one hundred percent of all 300 and 400 division PSYC courses for approved psychology major, minor or honours students. Those who are not approved cannot enroll in these upper division courses until the open enrollment date.
