Senate Library Committee

MEETINGS HELD

The Senate Library Committee met 3 times during 2014/15:

- October 27, 2014
- February 16, 2015
- Iune 8, 2015

HIGLIGHTS

October 27, 2014

- Introduction to new Dean of Libraries, Gwen Bird
- Pressure on the serials budget continues to increase
- B. Owen provided an update on the Radar initiative a research data repository that has been funded by SFU's University Priority Fund since 2012. This SFU project has now become a key component of several national initiatives.
- Refworks is a citation management service that the Library subscribes to. The current Scholars Portal option that is provided by the Ontario College and University Libraries (OCUL) will be ceasing service as of August 2015. Possible options for migration to a new hosting service were considered by the committee.
- New format of Library Annual Report was presented

February 16, 2015

- Library is working with the Budget Office to address fluctuations in the US Dollar, and its impact on the collections budget.
- SFU Library partnered with University of British Columbia and University of Victoria to purchase an array of digital archival products from Gale/Cengage at a deeply discounted rate under the banner "Points to the Past".
- Inaugural Library Undergraduate Award was given to Omeed Lakhani, a volunteer learning and writing peer in the Student Learning Commons
- A Task Group, including members of Senate Library Committee, has been created to finalize principles/strategies for identifying resources to cancel as part of a Collections Cost Reduction exercise.

- SFU Library is participating in a Shared Print Archive Network, a Western Canadian collaboration to collectively manage the preservation of print volumes.
- New fines/blocking policy implemented. Blocks were placed on patrons with fines over \$50. Many items were returned to the collection after long absences, and over \$9000 in unpaid fines were collected.
- Belzberg Library for 25th Anniversary of the Vancouver campus, the Library received new gates, furniture, carpets, two faster printers and an updated look.
- SFU hosted Librarians' Research Institute for the Canadian Association of Research Libraries, from June 15-19, 2015. Thirty participants from across Canada arrived for training in research methods and mentoring on librarians' scholarly research.

June 8, 2015

- Joy Johnson was appointed to the Institutional Mobilization Task Group (IMTG) of the Canadian Research Knowledge Network (CRKN)
- The Public Knowledge Project(PKP) received a small grant (\$75,000) from the Canadian Internet Registry Association
- Collections Cost Reduction Task Group has identified \$300,000 worth of cancellation
- Jennifer Hain Teper, Head of Preservation and Conservation, at University of Illinois, produced a report on preservation of the Library's physical collections
- New Research Commons space opened in SFU downtown campus
- An Open Access Advisory Committee will be established as a subcommittee of Senate Library Committee

Terms of Reference

- 1. Advises the University Librarian on matters relating to the operation of the Library and the liaison between the Library and academic departments and programs. The areas of advice include the following:
 - monitoring the continuing response to the Library Review Report recommendations and organizing subsequent reviews every five years
 - liaison between the Library and academic programs
 - establishing collections priorities
 - review of Library performance data
 - review of major changes in Library systems or operations
 - Advises the Vice President, Research on matters relating to the size of the Library budget.
- 2. Approves guidelines for the allocation of the Library materials budget between various fields of instruction and research.
- 3. Recommends changes in rules and regulations for the operation of the Library, such as the Loan Policy.
- 4. Reports to Senate annually concerning its activities and the operation of the Library.

Senate Library Committee/Library Penalties Appeal Committee (SLC/LPAC) Annual Report for Sept. 2014-Aug 2015

Senate Library Committee/Library Penalties Appeal Committee is the final level of appeal for any library fines, and forms a panel of the two senate library members and two student representatives. There were no actions brought to the Library Penalties Appeal Committee during the Sept. 2014 to August 2015 time period. The last appeal to LPAC was June 16, 2014 as reported in last year's summation. Currently there are 10 library fine appeals underway at the level just below LPAC. However it does not appear that any of these are likely to reach the final appeal of the LPAC during the coming year. The total number of initial appeals in 2014 was 507 so only a small fraction (2%) make it to the level below the LPAC. This number may be unusually high from a big spike at the beginning of that year because of the construction on the library main floor resulted in returned books not being checked in properly. Over the past 5 years there have been 4 appeals that came to the committee (once two in one year) hence it appears that these appeals are very irregular.




A Place for Learning


