I am pleased to submit the Annual Report of the Senate Policy Committee on Scholarships, Awards and Bursaries (SPCSAB) for the fiscal year 2014-2015.

#### Overview

SPCSAB is the committee charged by Senate with setting policy for the administration of awards, student scholarships, bursaries and other forms of financial aid at SFU. This is primarily for internal awards. Three other Senate committees, namely SUAAC (Senate Undergraduate Awards Adjudication Committee), SGAAC (Senate Graduate Awards Adjudication Committee) and SCUH (Senate Committee on University Honors) adjudicate financial awards to students where adjudication is needed. Financial Aid and Awards is a unit within Student Services, which processes bursary applications.

SPCSAB is not responsible for setting the amount of money available for scholarships, awards or bursaries. We include for information, reports from both undergraduate (Appendix 1) and graduate studies (Appendix 2) indicating how funds were distributed. Policy decisions by SPCSAB in the 2014-15 period are detailed in Table 1.

# NOTES

- (1) C.D. Nelson Scholarships are paid over three terms, normally starting in the Fall term. The figures reported may include recipients receiving their first award payment in previous years. The total number of award recipients reflects the number of students that were paid at least one installment of their C.D. Nelson Scholarship within the current fiscal year.
  - (2) The total number of Graduate Fellowships (excluded GF Supplemental) reflects the number of award payments made to graduate students within the fiscal year.
- (3) Formerly called the Presiden'ts Research Stipend. This award was changed to the President's PhD Scholarship in Fall 2012.
- (4) In Fiscal years 2012 to 2015, there were two options to receive funds for the Travel & Minor Research Awards program. Departments can choose to pay the funds directly to the students and be reimbursed by Graduate Studies
- (5) Formerly called Graduate International Scholarships. Name was changed to Graduate International Research Travel Awards effective May 2008. These awards are now funded out of the SBA budget starting in FY2011-2012.
  - (6) The first offers for the Graduate Aboriginal Entrance Scholarships went out in Fall 2013. Formerly, this was paid from the SBA account (91211). In January 2014, the funds were transferred to its own account (91222). These
- (7) The Vice President's Undergraduate Research Student Awards (VPR-USRA) for Science and Humanities were offered starting in FY 2010-2011. These awards are funded by the VP Research office.
- The disbursements were moved to SIMS (formerly from payrroll payments) starting in Summer 2014. The figures in FY2014-15 includes a few awards that started in Spring 2014, but where the actual payments continued to April 2015
  - (8) The NSERC & SSHRC GGSF expenses for FY2014-2015 consists of expenses for SSHRC award adjudication meeting, and reimbursement for GF supplemental awards spending.
