Subject: Report of the Senate Committee to Recommend Procedures for the Election of Three Student Representatives to the Senate.

1. Eligibility of Candidates for Nomination

A. Undergraduates

1. Must have been admitted to a degree program at Simon Fraser University. "Special", "Unclassified" and other non-degree students such as some in the Professional Development Program are not eligible.
2. Must be 19 years of age on or before due date for nominations.
3. Must have accumulated credits of 30 semester hours, 15 of which must be from Simon Fraser University on or before due date for nominations.
4. Must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.6 up to the end of the semester immediately preceding the one in which nominations are due.
5. Must be registered in the semester in which nominations are due, or if not, must have been registered in the immediately preceding semester and certified that not registered at any other institution.

B. Graduate Students

1. Must have been granted clear admission to graduate work by the Senate Committee on Graduate Admissions before the due date for nominations.
2. Must have completed at least one semester at Simon Fraser University before the due date for nominations.

2. Candidate's Eligibility to ^{Continue to hold} Hold Office as Representative of Students on Senate

A. Undergraduates

1. Must not miss two consecutive registrations.

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2. Must carry a minimum of 6 semester hours throughout any semester in which registered.
3. Must maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.0.
4. Must not register in any other institution.
5. Must not withdraw from the University or be required to withdraw from the University.

B. Graduate Students

1. Must be registered at the University either as on-campus graduate students or off-campus graduate students.

3. Eligibility of Electorate

1. All students registered at the time of balloting including "special", "unclassified", et.al. who are not degree candidates.
2. All students in good standing who were registered in category 1 and who have not missed three consecutive registrations at the time of the balloting and who certify that they are not registered at another institution and that they intend to register again at Simon Fraser University before missing three consecutive registrations.
3. In the case of graduate students, must be currently registered as on-campus graduate students or off-campus graduate students.

4. Balloting

at the first election of student rep.

The candidate receiving the highest number of votes will hold office for three years; the candidate with the second highest number of votes will hold office for two years; the candidate receiving the third highest number of votes will hold office for one year.

Subsequent

~~Re~~-election of student representatives will be for three year terms.
