3. 2018 Study Abroad Program Statistics (Appendix A)

Reports A and B provide an overview of activity through the Formal Exchange Program, plus activity through special inbound programs and outbound study abroad programs that operate outside of an exchange mechanism. Exchange activity was well-balanced in 2017/18, as the result of intentional efforts to send and receive equal numbers of student terms. The apparent decrease in unique student count for outbound and inbound activity is a result of the change in reporting period since the previous reports would have double-counted students who participated in programs spanning two Calendar Years (such double-counts were noted in previous reports).

Report C provides an overview of the Field Schools that operated in 2017/18. As expected, field school activity increased significantly from 2016. The number of students participating in field schools increased by 90% over 2016 as the result of an increase in field school offerings. Three brand new field schools were offered in 2017 (NATO Political Sciences, London & Lake District English, and International Perspective on Cybercrime in Criminology), and one was brought back after a 7-year hiatus (Greece Hellenic Studies). (NOTE that this is the same data as reported in the 2017 statistics.)

Report D shows total study abroad program activity by country.

The top 5 exchange destinations for SFU students were:

- 1. England
- 2. South Korea
- 3. France
- 4. Tie between: Netherlands, Australia, Hong Kong, Japan, Singapore
- 5. Denmark

The countries where we had the most overall student activity (outbound, field schools and inbound) were:

- 1. France
- 2. England
- 3. Italy
- 4. Netherlands
- 5. Hong Kong

This distribution of countries is far more diverse than the Canadian average reported by Universities Canada where the top five are UK, USA, France, Australia, and Germany.

<u>Reports E and F</u> show outbound student activity by faculty and department/program, respectively. The faculties sending the highest number of students on study abroad programs are the Faculty of Arts (160) and the Beedie School of Business (123).

The departments/units sending the highest number of students on study abroad programs are the Beedie School of Business, Political Science (42) and Communication (40).




*Outbound Study Abroad refers to SFU who students who attend a partner institution for 1 to 3 terms under the terms of a formal agreement with another institution. Students pay tuition fees directly to their host institution.

*** Years 1992/93 - 2009/10 were reported by Academic Year (Fall, Spring , Summer). The Fall 2010 term was reported separately. Years 2011 to 2017 were reported by Calendar Year (Spring, Summer Fall). Years 2017/18 to present were reported by Fiscal Year (Summer, Fall, Spring) which coincides with the Exchange Program Year. As a result, the Summer 2017 and Fall 2017 terms are reported in both the 2017 Calendar Year stats and the 2017/18 Fiscal Year stats.

Over time, annual numbers have been reported in terms of either term counts or unique student counts, as represented above. Beginning in the 2015 calendar year, numbers are reported in both ways.
