Text and sound are used as the stimulus for development of visual narratives through shape, colour, line, texture and composition. Students cultivate essential art direction skills through photo essays, storyboards, animatics, character design, costume design, lighting design, mise-en-scene and cinematography. Classic texts are re-envisioned to develop a critical analysis of contemporary visual archetypes.	Description Students will practice how to use imagery to tell compelling stories and narrate ideas. Using contemporary and historical frameworks, explorations of story structures and narrative storytelling techniques will lead you towards production of multi-platform digital artifacts. At the end of this course you will be able to think critically about the ethical and moral considerations of global and inclusive visual storytelling.


