Action undertaken by the Senate Graduate Studies Committee at its Meeting on November 12, 1985, gives rise to the following motion:

MOTION:

"That Senate approve and recommend approval to the Board of Governors, as set forth in S.85-64, the proposed graduate curriculum changes for MRM:

i) Change Calendar Entry

m: At least 65 credit hours are prescribed for the program, 40 of which are from the required group of courses and 25 are from the electives. A further 10 credit hours from the required group must be completed by students whose overall academic background is deficient. Normally, students may be permitted formal transfer credit for 10 hours of the basic 65 credit-hour program for courses taken elsewhere.

Under these regulations, a student with previous graduate-level training in appropriate areas, and with a suitable undergraduate background, could normally complete the MRM Program requirements with a minimum of 45 credit hours of work at Simon Fraser University. The program of studies for each student must be approved by the Director.

To: Seventy-five (75) credit hours are prescribed for the program, fify (50) of which are from the required group and twenty-five (25) are from the electives. With the approval of the Program Director, up to seven courses (35 credit hours) may be transfer credits from another institution."

CURRENT CALENDAR
