A theoretical analysis of alternative policy approaches to major issues facing society. A practical analysis of the structures and processes surrounding major contemporary policy issues and an examination of the nature and substance of those policy issues. Particular emphasis will be placed on resource management issues.

TO: MRM 644-5 Public Policy Analysis and Administration

An analysis of methods of policy-making and problem solving with particular emphasis on natural resource issues. Topics include goal setting, problem definition, program scheduling, policy evaluation, policy implementation and public administration. A practical analysis of the structures and processes surrounding major contemporary policy issues"


