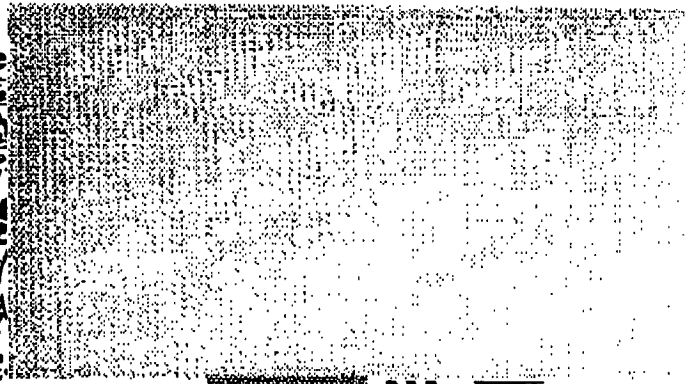

#### TO APPLY AND REGISTER:

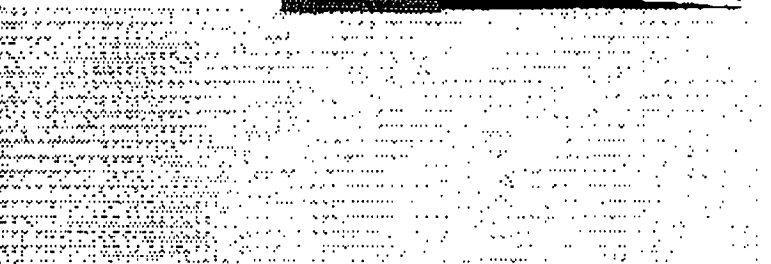
The Summer Institute in Environmental Education is a credit programme of the Faculty of Education at S.F.U. Students taking the Institute enroll for Education 452-8, and will receive 8 semester hours of credit on successful completion. Regular course tuition fees apply, and there is an additional field activity fee of \$35.00. Students should apply to register as soon as possible, because enrollment will be limited. Students who do not live in the South Okanagan Region can arrange to live in residence at Berger Hall on the KLO Road Campus of Okanagan University College. Berger Hall is within walking distance of the SFU Regional Center which is also located on the KLO Road Campus. Room rates vary depending on the type of accommodation chosen and range from \$298.00/month to \$398.00/month.

The Institute is offered as an Intensive Summer Programme. It will commence on July 4, 1995, and the first day of classes will be Tuesday July 4 and the last day will be Thursday, July 27. The class may spend three days in residence at the field at the McQueen Lake Environmental Study Centre (near Kamloops) during Week Two of the course. Students enrolled in the Institute will have full use of the Macintosh Computer Lab at the Kelowna Centre during the Institute.

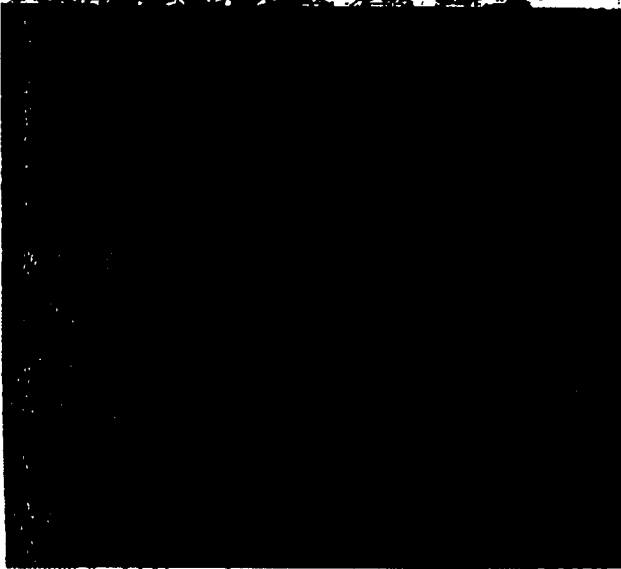

## 1995 Summer Institute in Environmental Education.

In the summer of 1995 Simon Fraser University will offer its Summer Institute in Environmental Education at its Kelowna Regional Centre. The Institute, now in its 24th year of offering, is intended to provide teachers and other educators with an opportunity to consider the educational opportunities and implications of human-environment interactions.

The Institute is interdisciplinary in nature and will consider the environment through the perspectives of the Natural and Social Sciences, Humanities, Economics, and the Arts. The Institute will also address educational programming from K-Adult levels. The programme provides a full mix of field experiences, seminars, lectures, and hands-on activities in settings ranging from nature centres to the inner city.

In 1995 the Institute will be offered by an Interdisciplinary Team which will be coordinated by:

### **Milton McClaren, Ph.D.**

*Associate Professor and Director, Field Relations and Teacher Continuing Education, Simon Fraser University, Faculty of Education. Dr. McClaren has extensive experience with all aspects of Environmental Education and has been a member of the Steering Committee of Project WILD (US), of the Man and the Biosphere Programme Committee of UNESCO Canada, and is currently a member of the Education Advisory Committee of the Aspen Global Change Institute. In 1993 he was the recipient of the Minister's Environmental Award in B.C. He is co-author of the Royal Society of Canada's Global Change Teachers Handbook and was a member of the authoring team for the BC Water Stewardship Program.*

### **Bill Hammond, M.Sc.**

*President, Natural Context, Fort Myers, Florida. Bill Hammond is an internationally known environmental educator, a former member of the steering committees of Project WILD and Project Learning Tree (US), a current member of the South Florida Water Commission, and a recipient of the Conservation Teacher of the Year Award from the National Wildlife Federation of the U.S. In 1994-95 he has been involved in the development of Project GLOBE, an international programme of education about global environmental change.*

The Teaching Team is supported by other resource persons who work with various segments of the programme. In previous years they have included many outstanding environmental educators including Kim Fulton, Brian Herrin, Rick Kool, Joanne Nicklas, Susan Close, Carl de Bruyn, and Michael Cohen.

### To Apply and Register.

The Summer Institute in Environmental Education is a credit programme of the Faculty of Education at S.F.U. Regular course tuition fees apply, and there is an additional field activity fee of \$35.00. Students who have not previously attended SFU must apply for admission before registering. Former SFU students should apply to register as soon as possible, because enrolment will be limited.

### Accommodation.

Students who do not live in the South Okanagan Region can arrange to live in residence at Berger Hall on the KLO Road Campus of Okanagan University College. Berger Hall is within walking distance of the SFU Regional Centre which also is located on the KLO Road Campus. Room rates vary depending on the type of accommodation chosen and range from \$275.00/month to 410.00/month. ### ROOM DESCRIPTIONS

#### POD:

A pod is one of five private single rooms set in a cluster or "POD", each with a lounge, 2 bathrooms and a common kitchen and dining area. Each of the single rooms includes a single bed, desk, chair, lamp, notice board and closet. There is a single entrance from the common area of the pod leading to the main hall of the floor. A few larger rooms are available at a small premium.

#### STUDIO SUITE:

A studio suite has its own private entrance from the main hall of the floor. It contains a private bathroom, kitchenette, single bed, desk, chair, lamp, notice board and closet.

#### SHARED STUDIO SUITE:

A shared studio suite has its own private entrance from the main hall of the floor. It contains two single beds, kitchenette, one bathroom, two desks, two chairs, two lamps, one notice board and closet. Shared suites are allocated only to students who apply together to share the suite.

### OTHER FACILITIES:

There are 2 TV lounges and study rooms and coin c laundry facilities. The main floor has a large activity room for video games. Bike storage and box storage space is available on the ground floor. Heat, light and water are included in the rate. A dedicated parking spot is available to residents at \$100/month. Telephone and cable hook-ups are available in each room ready for you to sign up with Shaw Cable or BC Tel if you wish.

### SUMMER (May to August):

Students whose courses extend to May or June, and those who wish to remain living on campus during summer may do so by making arrangements with the Student Housing office. Short Term rates will apply.

### CONDITIONS OF OCCUPANCY:

Occupation of any room is subject to signing a Licence Agreement with Okanagan University College which explains the conditions applicable to staying in Residence. Once a room is occupied, a 30-day period of cancellation is applicable.
